## INTRODUCTION

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Dramatic landscapes, extraordinary adventure, and prolific wildlife come together at Victoria Falls and Chobe National Park.

Touted as the adventure capital of Africa, Victoria Falls offers a plethora of exhilarating activities for thrill-seekers; however, the most exciting feature is seeing this 355-foot tall and 5,500-foot wide behemoth churn 550-million liters of water per minute over its sheer cliff face, the mist from the spray rising high into the air.



Just a short distance away, Chobe National Park in northern Botswana is one of Africa's most beloved protected areas.

Famed for its enormous herd of elephants, Chobe's sandy roads bring intrepid travelers on a unique journey complete with fantastic big game sightings, riverine experiences, and quintessentially African landscapes.

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## SUGGESTED ITINERARY: 4 NIGHTS, 5 DAYS

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**Day 1:** Fly from Lusaka to Livingstone and check into your relaxing hotel.

This evening, take a boat ride down the river as the sun sets, enjoying the sights and sounds of the mighty Zambezi in the background as you float peacefully on the water. Elephant and hippo sightings abound!

**Day 2:** This morning, experience the iconic Victoria Falls waterfall first hand. Your guide will accompany you to experience Mosi-oa-Tunya — affectionately called “the smoke that thunders”—from different vantage points.

In the afternoon, spend time at leisure, or kayak peacefully in the river. Please inquire if you would like to book a helicopter ride over the falls. An aerial view is one of the best ways to grasp the sheer magnitude of this natural wonder!

**Day 3:** Just a short drive away is Chobe National Park, an excellent place to spot big game, predators, and some of the largest herds of elephant on the continent of Africa. The Chobe River carves through this otherwise dry landscape, drawing prolific wildlife to its riverbanks for fantastic photographic opportunities.

This evening, watch a blissful African sunset illuminates the sky as you enjoy a sundowner cocktail and settle into your camp for the evening.

**Day 4:** Today is yours to explore Chobe National Park at length. The extensive park spans across 11,700 square kilometers and has been a mainstay safari destination since its inception in 1967. Set squarely in the migration route of elephants between Zimbabwe and Angola, Chobe’s claim to fame is without doubt, it’s unbeatable elephant sightings.

Explore the park by vehicle, or by boat or canoe, viewing wildlife from a new perspective as they come to the river to drink. Enjoy a peaceful lunch before setting off for further exploration in the afternoon and spending the night in the park.

**Day 5:** Depart Chobe for your flight back to Lusaka to connect with your international departure home.
